A devastating fire disaster on March 3, hit the Liberian Government Hospital, the biggest public health facility in the Buchanan, Grand Bassa county, leaving critical facilities and essential materials damaged. The LNRCS realizing the present ruined state of the hospital as a grave setback to the county's health sector, made an initial donation on March 14, 2022 of assorted IPC Materials which contained 17 different kinds for the doctors and nurses to continue their lifesaving services.

LNRCS RESPONDS TO NEW KRU TOWN STAMPEDE

-Provides PSS & Tracing Services to affected families



At least 29 people including 11 children and 18 adults including a pregnant woman were killed in a stampede on January 19, 2022 after an all-night Christian worship event at in New Kru Town Community. Additional 15 persons were also admitted for treatment at the Redemption Hospital. The LNRCS was among the first responders and worked with health authority and the National Disaster Management Agency in providing Psychosocial Support to the bereaved families and aided them in tracing their loved ones either at the treatment center or in the mortuary at the Hospital. The LNRCS staff and volunteers were deployed and a tank erected as a service point.
